Tours leave from the SOAS stand (B13) every 30 minutes starting at 10:30 with the last tour leaving at 15.00.



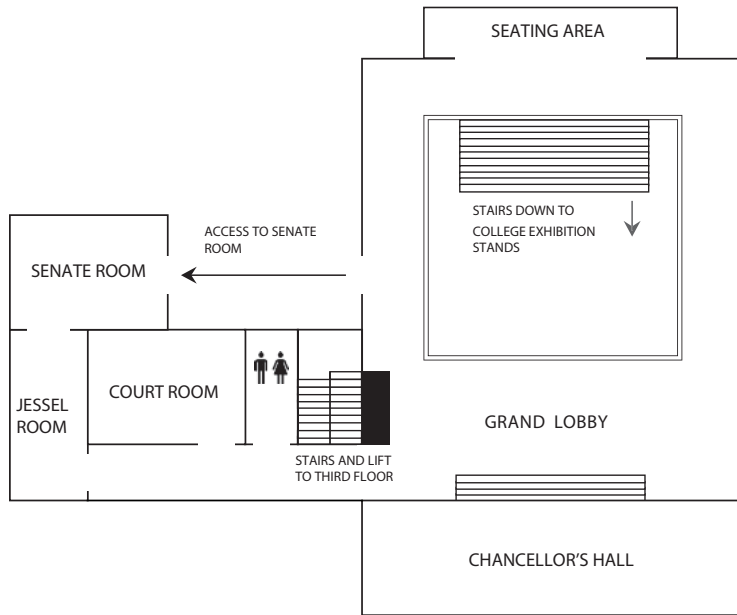

Tours will last approximately 45 minutes.

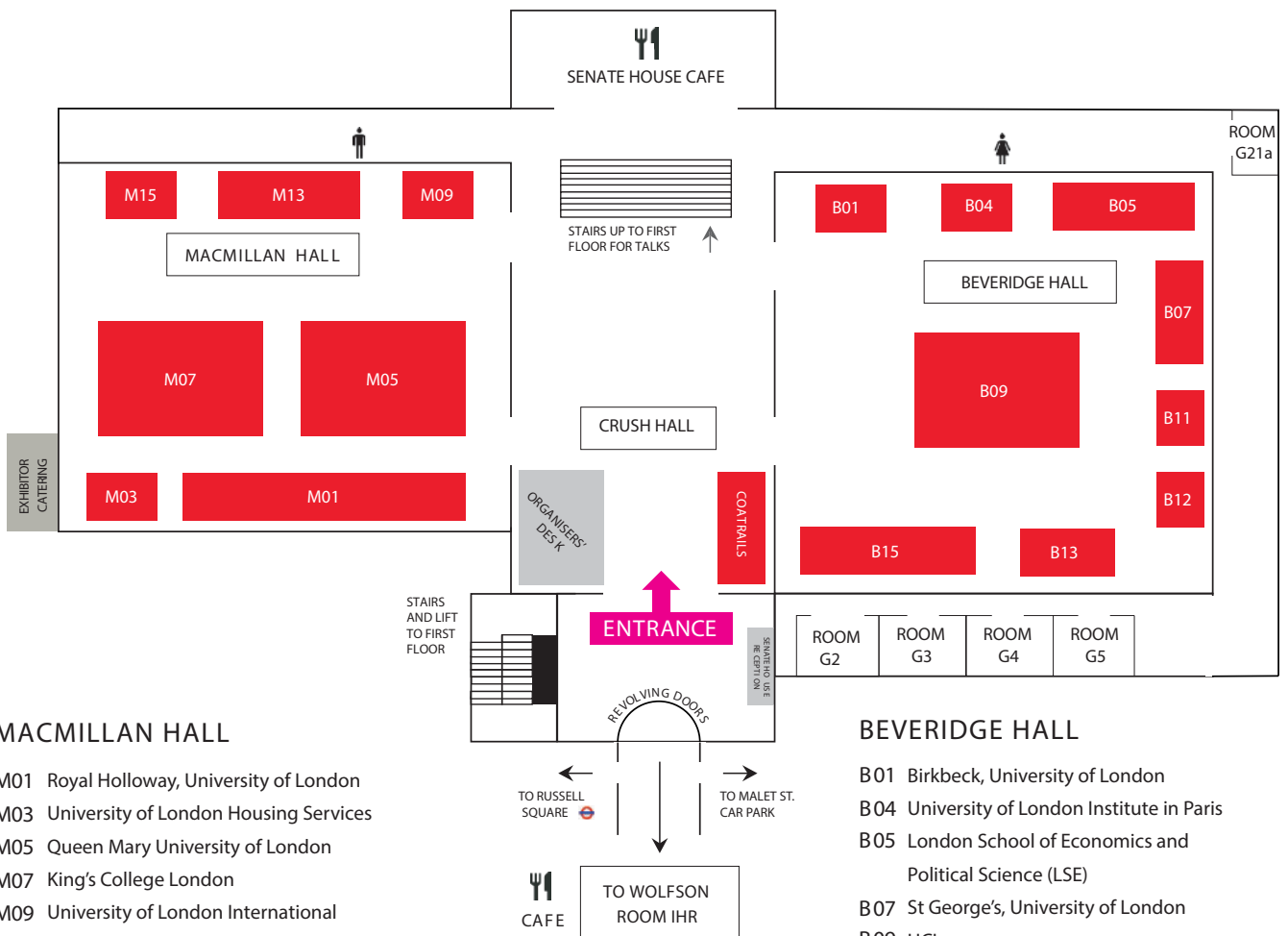
1 FIRST FLOOR
